1. Scott Carter from Special Districts discussed solution to fixing the street lights in down town Upperlake. Explained they had inspected power box that controlled the street lights and that there were melted wires and shorts in the system. He then stated they were in the diagnosis phase and trouble shooting. However, there is not an eta of resolution. You can Reach Scott at 707-263-0119.

2. Claudine followed up with Code Enforcements accomplishments in the Upper lake area.

3. Jonathan Armas, The Animal Control Director discussed animal control process. He discussed the Ordinance Law; (Any animal loose on their own owners property does not have to be fenced in or on a leash) Therefore, Member Thomas asked Supervisor Crandell if a new ordinance could be introduced by the Supervisors making it unlawful to have your dog not fenced in or leashed on a property. Supervisor Crandell said he would get back to Thomas Aceves on this issue.

Director Armas also discussed if a a person wanted to pursue a case against an animal owner, that they would have to become a witness in court.

Member Claudine Pedroncelli brought up the issue of over populated felines. Director Armas mentioned that their Vet had passed away and they should be getting some Vet replacements to reinstate the program by July 2022.

4. Candidate Hannah Faith Lee spoke to our meeting members and board about her candidacy For Lake County Assessor-Recorder. She discussed Proposition 8 and how when it was rolled out it was not communicated effective to the public on the impact on our property taxes. Therefore, she asked for every ones vote for the June ballot.

5. Middle Creek Workshop was discussed. Julia from the Upper lake Community who is working on this grave concern mentioned she needed the names of the contacts at Fish & Wildlife and

The Army Core of Engineers who oversees the levees. Julia also received historical data from The Lake Water Resource division. Julia also said that The State Water Board told her she should make a complaint with The EPA.

6. Olga Steele from the community discussed the success of The Road map Task force in The Clearlake Oaks Community which is funded by designated cannibus funds.

7. Supervisor Crandell discussed the Road Repair plan for the Northshore. He then presented two slides showing roads that would be resurfaced and chip sealed.

8. Julia from the Upper Lake Community announced Upperlake will be having a Harvest Festival on October 11<sup>th</sup>, in Downtown Upperlake.
