Meeting called to Order 5:02pm

Approve by Roll Call Vote:

June 27, 2022 meeting minutes were approved by roll call vote.

Open Forum – Share your concerns and ideas with District 4 Supervisor, Tina Scott
Supervisor Scott was thanked by the Council members for her continued support and wished her well with her new position

Sky C. Hoyt advised Scotts Valley Road is in need of maintenance.
Requests have been forwarded to Public Works/Roads Dept.

Guest Speaker– There was no guest speaker. Council member Terre Logsdon to coordinate with BLM for a guest speaker at the August meeting to discuss the South Cow Mountain Management Area Implementation Plan.

Old Business

- Request to clear Scotts Creek (approximately 3 miles) –Lake County Water Resources will need “right of entry” forms signed by property owners adjacent to Scotts Creek to access the creek bed. Provided William Fox, Lake County Water Resources the APN’s of those properties adjacent to Scotts Creek. Requested a meeting with Water Resources and Director Scott DeLeon to provide justification to begin this project. Specifically, the history of flooding and clearing Scotts Creek (Scotts Valley Road is the only road connecting Highways 20 & 29, levee failures,

Scotts Creek is a main tributary to Clear Lake and finally and more importantly funds are available now for the project.

- City of Lakeport South Main Annexation update – Going to a vote on the November 8th general election ballot for those registered voters in that area
- Multi-Tribal Fire Prevention Grant Application to CAL FIRE to support Scotts Valley Firewise Community – Terre Logsdon reported the grant award of approximately \$30K will be available in the Fall of 2022. The funds will be used primarily for reflective signs for residents. This is a Tribal grant and the award will pass through the Tribe to Scotts Valley
- South Cow Mountain Management Area Implementation Plan – Laura Hall was identified as the county BLM liaison, Terre to contact.
- Broadband coverage for Scotts Valley - Susan Parker, Lake County CAO is the contact. A presentation to the Board of Supervisors is scheduled on August 4th from 1 – 3 PM to discuss rollout and timeline. Scotts Valley is on the list.

New Business

- New Use Permits – Council Member Terre Logsdon reported no new Use Permits.
- Scotts Valley Groundwater Protection Committee –The committee is keeping an eye on
 - FLASHES
 - North Lakeport expansion
 - Well water monitoring
 - Lakeport Drought Mitigation Plan- recommended treated wastewater for parks to save 15% water usage
 - Suggested a warning system; Yellow and then Red if aquifer is not refilled during dry years
 - City of Lakeport needs to notify Scotts Valley Advisory Council if the city requires emergency use of SV aquifer
 - The City of Lakeport is issuing a RFP to upgrade the waste water treatment system
 - The committee recommends protected uses of irrigation
 - Sara Ryan, Big Valley Band of Pomo Indians presented free water analysis for safe drinking water. www.cal-watch.org to determine eligibility
 - Watchduty.org provides early information regarding fires

- Scotts Valley Firewise Committee update -Vice Chair Greg Scott – The Lake County Fire Safe Council meets the second Thursday of the month at 10AM and continues to work on the resource directory.
Cornelia has registered a SV Firewise Community (Eickhoff Road residents) and attended training and she will work with Greg.
