Participants were able to swim, jump off a rope swing,

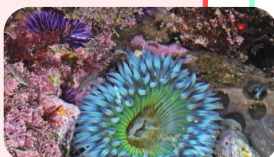


and kayak. Special thanks to the Sheriff's Activity League for the kayaks! Since the kick-off the
